Track 1: Star Dreams

Reclaim the earliest resonance of your creative self.

'Imagine you're flipping through old records of yourself. You pick one from childhood...'

REFLECTION PROMPTS

① What kind of music star did you dream of being as a kid?

Who did you imagine listening with? (Alone? On a road trip? In your room?)

What part of that star self still lives in you?

What's one musical memory from childhood that still plays in you?

Attune to your current energetic signature.

What genre or musical mood best describes your work right now?



(3) Where is it playing?

(A rooftop at golden hour, a neighborhood bar with string lights, a mossy forest studio, an underground club, headphones on a crowded train, beside a mountain stream)

What emotional state do people usually arrive in when they meet your work?

Overwhelmed, curious, numb, seeking calm, heavy-hearted, lit up, disconnected, tender, hopeful



What emotional tone do people leave with after being in your presence?

Open, grounded, softened, clearer, activated, harmonized, reconnected, reverent

What surprised you in naming your current sound?

Tracks 2 - 5: Soundtrack Now

TRACKS 6 & 7: SONIC DETAILS



Feel into the rhythm, shape, and layered influences behind your sound.

[6] What rhythm or instrument best expresses your work? (Brush snare, heartbeat drum, slow bassline, staccato piano, deep synth, rustling leaves, trickling stream)

[7] What's a subtle or unexpected influence on your sound? (Jazz improvisation, birdsong, 90s R&B, protest chants, lullabies, gospel choirs, Tibetan bells, club anthems)

#Share: What's one texture, rhythm, or unexpected influence that surprised you when you named it?

Track 8: Shadow + Play

Make space for what's wild, hidden, and soulful.



(8) If you could release an anonymous album — no name, no expectations — what kind of music would it be?

(Genre, mood, theme — your shadow world, your wild edge, your private joy)

*Share: If you had a secret side project — what would its vibe or genre be?

Track 9:

ALBUM OF THE YEAR

Now imagine this: you've just won Album of the Year — for the work you've already done. You take the mic. The crowd goes quiet. What do you say.

 Who are you thanking in your acceptance speech? Who are you grateful for? Or who were your biggest musical influences (real or metaphorica)? (Mentor, archetypes, musical ancestor, community, influence – the ones who shaped your tone

Album of the Year

What will you do with the prize money?

Start a label?
Build a forest stage?
Fund someone else's voice?
Make your next album in nature?



Fast forward. Your music has a life of its own. It's reaching people. Who do you want to collaborate with next?



[10] Which band, singer, or voice do you want to collaborate with — real or in spirit?

If you could collab with any artist (dead or alive) to express the hidden edge of your work — who would it be?

Tracks 11 & 12

Fast forward. Who shows up to your shows again and again? What's changing in them?

(11) What kind of audience/superfans consistently show up for your shows?

Are they coaches? Caregivers?
Founders? Grievers? Builders?
What room are they in — the
quiet house concert, the
underground venue, the open mic?



(12) What do they get out of coming to see you play every week?

What changes in them when they sit in your sound? What do they carry home?

You've changed the room. Now change the world.



Fast forward. What's changing in the world because of your sound?

[13] If you could organize a global benefit concert — what would your music change? What kind of world are you composing with your sound?

[14] What's your next song, dance move, or playlist?

Is it a song you need to hear?
A playlist you want to make?
A musical message you're ready to send back into the world?

What's the name of your next album?

(One that only you could write — a reflection of the chapter that's arriving)



#Share: What kind of people are in your audience — and what are they showing up for in you?
